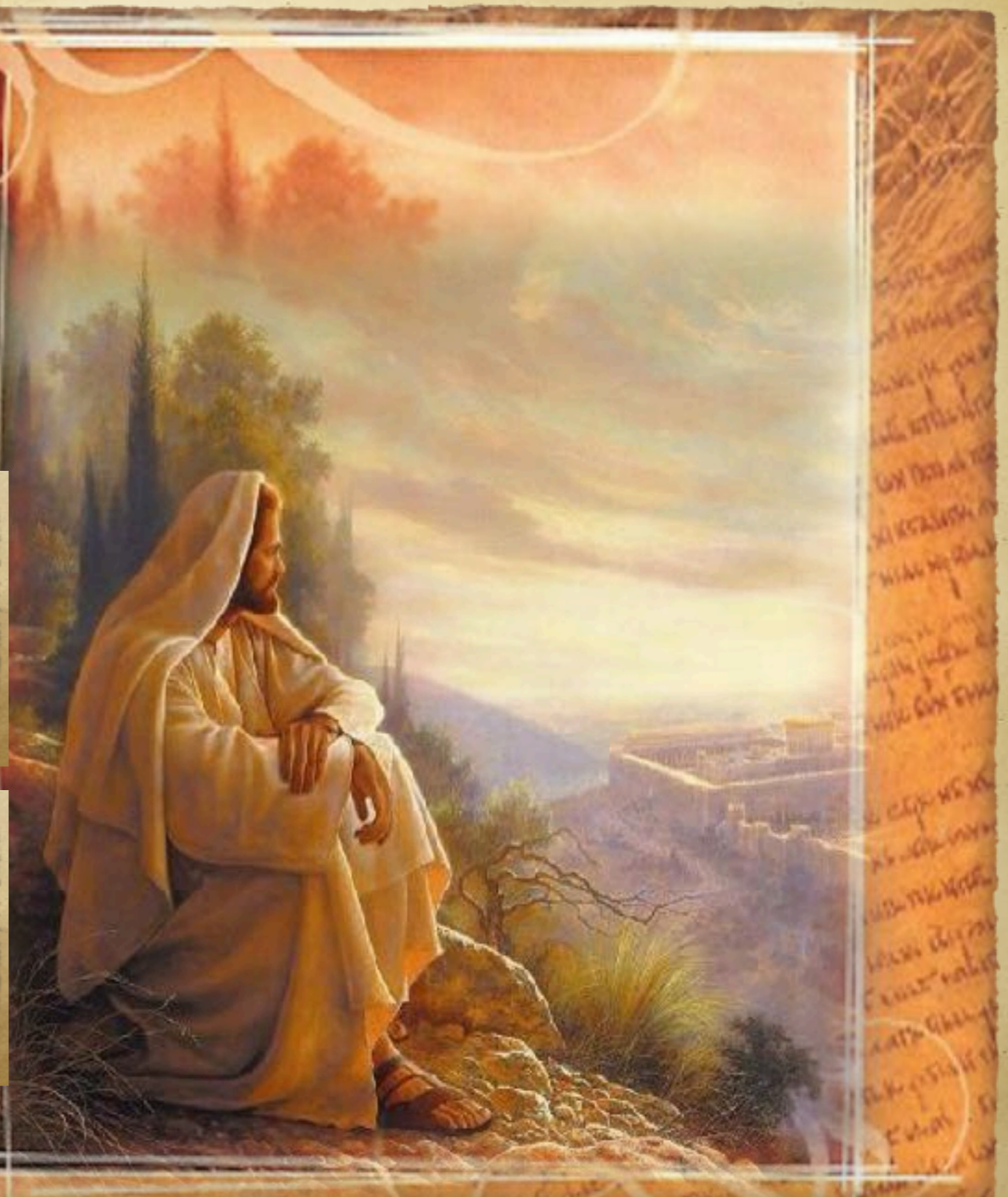

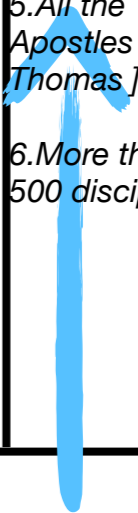

<p>Jesus arrives in Bethany near sundown.</p> <p>The rest of the caravan goes on to Jerusalem.</p> <p>They announce to the city "<i>Jesus of Nazareth is here!</i>" [Keep in mind Jesus did not attend the year before.]</p>	<p>Jesus invited to the house of Simon in Bethany for "end of Sabbath" meal</p> <p>Mary anoints Jesus for burial</p> <p>Judas is rebuked—devises a sinister plan.</p> <p>Mat and Mk record this scene as a "flashback" in order to tie it with the deal Judas makes with the Sanhedrin on Tuesday eve.</p>	<p>Messianic Presentation — "Triumphal Entry" into Jerusalem</p> <p>Jesus told the Pharisees in Perea "you will not see me until you say, 'Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!'" Lk 13:34</p> <p>This is partly fulfilled this day. It will be fully fulfilled when He returns in Glory.</p> <p>As in Galilee the year before, they want a King w/o a Cross.</p> <p>Returns to Bethany near sundown</p>	<p>Messianic Power —</p> <p>Curses a fig tree on the way into the Temple</p> <p>"Cleanses" the Temple of corruption (for the second time)</p> <p>Greeks seek Him</p> <p>Returns to Bethany near sundown</p>	<p>Messianic Controversy —</p> <p>The fig tree is withered</p> <p>Hard parables Hard questions Harsh words</p> <p>Jesus tells the Apostles of His Return... <i>The Olivet Discourse</i> Late in the day.</p> <p>Judas makes his deal with the Sanhedrin to betray Jesus sometime during the night</p> <p>Returns to Bethany near sundown</p>	<p>Messianic Silence —</p> <p>No activity recorded in the Gospels.</p> <p>Jesus is preparing for His last Passover.</p> <p>Judas and the Sanhedrin are preparing for His arrest.</p> <p>Remains in Bethany</p>	<p>Messianic Preparation —</p> <p>Peter and John sent to prepare the Passover</p> <p>They gather after sunset.</p> <p>Jesus washed the feet, Judas leaves.</p> <p>Lord's Passover Remembrance is instituted</p> <p>Judas has betrayed Jesus.</p> <p>Brings guard to arrest Him</p> <p>Jesus goes to Gethsemane Suffers Agony</p>	<p>Messianic Rejection —</p> <p>Jesus arrested very early Friday.</p> <p>The Trials</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. <i>Annas</i> 2. <i>Sanhedrin</i> 3. Phil. 2:7-8 ... He emptied Himself,
by taking the form of a SLAVE,
being born in the likeness of men.

...He humbled Himself
by becoming obedient to the point of DEATH,
even DEATH on a cross.

μεταμέλο metamelō “regret”

“I broke it! I must FIX it!”

μετάνοια metanoia “repent”

“I broke it! Will YOU please FIX IT?”

RESENTMENT: “I want YOU Dead!

*They put him to death by
hanging him on a tree*

REMORSE: “I want ME Dead!”

...he went [to a tree] and hanged himself

2 Cor 7:10 ... Godly grief produces a repentance (*metanoia*) that leads to salvation without regret (*metameleo*), whereas worldly grief (sorrow that is produces only regret *metameleo*] produces death

Jn 6:70 “Did I not choose you, the twelve? And yet one of you is a devil.”

Jn 13:18 I know whom I have chosen. But the Scripture will be fulfilled, ‘He who ate my bread has lifted his heel against me.’

Mat 26:24 ... woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been better for that man if he had not been born.”

“Was it possible for Judas to desire forgiveness? We get into some deep theological water because the text tells us that these things had to come to pass. But let me talk to those of you who maybe are on the verge of becoming a traitor, of becoming a Judas. You can, if you desire, come to the Only One who can save you. Judas had remorse. What is remorse? Remorse is looking at your sin apart from the forgiveness of Christ.”
